## 2.2. Syllables in Tocharian

- Syllables play a role in Tocharian meter.
- Tocharian meter is purely syllable counting.
- Stress and/or syllable weight are disregarded.
  
- Verses are subdivided into stanzas.
- Stanzas are subdivided into lines (pāda).
- Lines have a fixed number of syllables.
- Lines are subdivided into cola.
  
- The following TB example is taken from CEToM THT 107 b4

## Syllables in Tocharian

- The example is the very common type 4x12 (4/4/4).
- Other common types are:
  - 4x12 (5/4/3)
  - 4x14 (4/3/4/3)
  - 4x15 (4/3/3/5)
  - 4x17 (6/6/5)
  - 4x18 (4/3/4/3/4)
  - 4x25 (5/5/8/7)
